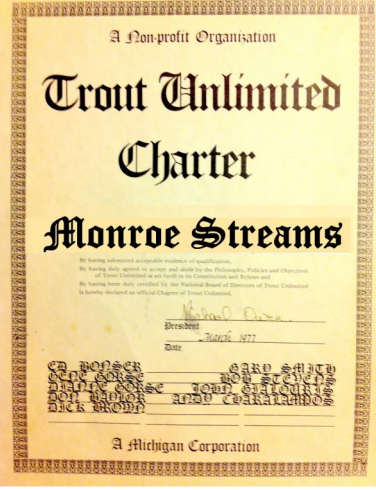


Habitat Work

The first officers were Ed Bonser, President, Henry Fremount, Vice President, Diane Grose, Secretary and John Gialouris, Treasurer. The early meetings were held in the Windsor Fly Shop on North 9th Street in Stroudsburg. Henry Fremount followed Ed Bonser as President, and we moved meetings to the East Stroudsburg University. Today, our meetings are held at the Monroe County Environmental Education Center located at 8050 Running Valley Road, near Bartonsville, PA.

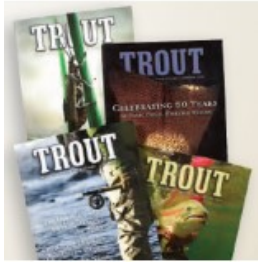

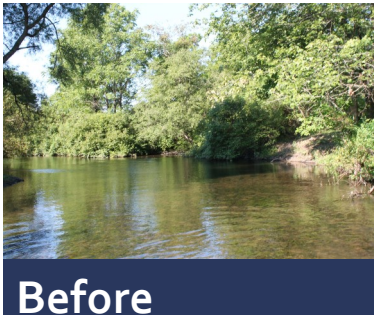

## Protection

The Brodhead Chapter works with local government and conservancies to advocate and provide some financial assistance for the protection of our coldwater resources including headwater streams at Jonas Preserve and Conklin Park to the main stem of the Brodhead Creek at ForEvergreen Preserve and every stream in between. The Poconos are blessed with tremendous bounty of exceptional wild trout streams and it is our mission to protect them. A recent project had chapter volunteers installing signs promoting catch and release on the Cranberry Creek, the headwaters of the Paradise Creek, and at the ForEvergreen Preserve.

## Stream Restoration Projects

The chapter has worked to restore thousands of feet of stream damaged by storms and man. Tons of boulders have been carefully placed in many of our public waters to de-channelize streams and create a more diverse aquatic habitat. We intend to keep momentum going with more projects every year. To date work has been completed on the Martin's Creek near Bangor, the Brodhead Creek near Analomink, the Pocono Creek in Tannersville, and the McMichael Creek near Stroudsburg and Sciota. like the 600 seedlings that the Chapter planted along the Tobyhanna Creek. The shade provided by trees reduces thermal impacts on the stream and the leaf litter from trees actually forms the base of the food pyramid for many streams.

## Riparian Buffer Restoration

One of the best ways to protect a stream and improve the aquatic habitat is to plant a tree, and the only thing better than planting a tree is planting a whole lot of trees

## Stream Monitoring

The Chapter is actively monitoring two streams to gather baseline data that will be used as comparison data to measure impacts from Marcellus Shale Extraction including the impacts of pipeline projects. The Chapter also regularly includes a monitoring element into our conservation projects to measure the success through documenting the trout population before and after the project. We also fund macro-invertebrate studies to determine if a development project is having a negative impact on aquatic life. There are additional citizen science projects available through the national organization.

## Education and Advocacy

The Chapter holds many educational general meeting programs on fishing and conservation topics that are free to the public. The Chapter holds several Introduction to Fly Fishing Classes throughout the year, along with annual Fly Tying classes. The Chapter also is involved in programs to introduce women to fly fishing and programs that assist military veterans in learning the art of fly fishing.
